2014 Community Impact Fund Awardees

SCACED held one grant round in 2014 for the Community Impact Fund - made possible with support from the Mary Reynolds Babcock Foundation. SCACED set aside \$40,000 for the 2014 CIF Grant Round with an emphasis on supporting members with smaller budgets and a greater perceived need for small grant capital. All \$40,000 was obligated.

- <u>CDC of Marlboro County</u> (\$10,000) Housing Rehabilitation Program: To provide home and emergency repairs for eligible low income homeowners in Marlboro County.
- <u>Increasing H.O.P.E.</u> (\$10,000) Home Rehabilitation Project: Increasing H.O.P.E. will present a quality of life project to offer affordable housing and financial education training targeted to low- to moderate-income individuals. First, Increasing HOPE will coordinate the rehabilitation of a home to be sold to a low-to-moderate income individual. Next, financial education training will be provided to the new homeowners to support their new responsibilities.
- <u>Allendale County ALIVE</u> (\$10,000) Create a full time Housing Developer position on staff to increase capacity to provide affordable rental and homeownership opportunities in Allendale. ALIVE will match the funds with \$50,250 in earned revenue funds. The Housing Developer will manage all rental properties, develop rental and homeownership housing projects.
- <u>Blackville CDC</u> (\$10,000) Equipment purchase to increase CDC capacity to include computers, screen and a projector. Allowing staff, volunteers and constituents access to better technology and training.
